Update on NOPEC Electricity Supplier

As many of you may already know, the Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council (NOPEC) has reached an agreement for NextEra Energy Services Ohio, LLC (NESO) to become the new supplier of electricity effective January 2017. FirstEnergy Solutions in late October announced it was terminating its contract three years early. NOPEC immediately began negotiating with suppliers on behalf of the communities it serves to reach a new agreement to insure its customers will continue to receive the benefits of NOPEC membership which have resulted in about \$250 million of electric cost savings to date.

By Ohio law, NOPEC is required to mail opt-out notices to its electric customers every three years. You should have received a mailing within the last few weeks to give you the option to opt-out of the program. If you want to remain in the NOPEC program, you need to do nothing. You will automatically remain in the NOPEC program and will continue to receive discounted aggregate pricing under the current supplier as well as the new supplier beginning January 2017. Tobacco-Free Workplace Environment Policy



I am happy to announce that effective January 1, 2017 the City of North Ridgeville will be joining our already tobacco-free Park and Recreational Facilities. In order that we may properly promote the health, safety and wellness of our employees, to eliminate the well-known risks associated to second-hand smoke, as well as to enhance the quality of life of all those whom we serve including residents who may visit our public City facilities and related areas; and in part to implement Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3794 (Smoke-Free Workplace Law), the City of North Ridgeville establishes a tobacco-free workplace environment.

The use of tobacco will be **prohibited** on all outside property or grounds owned, rented or leased by the City of North Ridgeville including in or on private vehicles while parked on City property. Use of tobacco means all uses of tobacco, including inhaling, exhaling, burning, vaping or carrying any lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, vaporizer, other lighted smoking device or papers for burning tobacco, or any other plant; chewing tobacco, snuff, or any other matter or substances that contain tobacco.

Our complete Tobacco-Free Workplace Environment Policy will be made available on the City's website in the coming weeks along with helpful resources. In addition, the Lorain County General Health District (LCGHD) offers residents a wealth of information and Tobacco Cessation tools including Ohio Quitline at 1-800-QUITNOW. Lorain County General Health District

The Lorain County General Health District (LCGHD) serves as our local health department and provides numerous services to our community. Every day your local health department works to prevent disease, to protect you, and to promote healthy choices. Below is an abbreviated list of services provided by LCGHD:

- ✓ Responsible for issuing licenses for restaurants, vending machines, solid waste disposal sites, campgrounds, marinas, private water systems, manufactured home parks, public pools, spas and beaches.
- ✓ Inspects, trains and educates over 1,000 places that serve you food (restaurants, grocery stores, food trucks, etc.). Facility inspections are conducted one to four times per year. These inspection reports are available online including any violations received by the establishment.
- ✓ Provides immunizations to thousands of children, adults and seniors; protecting you from the spread of harmful diseases. They hold annual flu clinics in our City.
- ✓ Protects the waters that you drink, play in, and enjoy by inspecting and monitoring pools, spas, and beaches, and provides flooding cleanup assistance.
- ✓ Works to prevent mosquito-related illness by treating areas of standing water, and education on the removal of standing water and other ways to avoid mosquito bites. LCGHD also works to prevent tick-related illnesses and protects the public from the threat of rabies through identification, investigation and education.
- ✓ Maintains a record of births and deaths in our County.

Weather and Safety Tip Reminders

Winter weather is just around the corner as is the holidays. Below are a few reminders to keep you and your family safe during these winter months:

- * When snow exceeds two inches within 24 hours, a **Snow Ban** is in effect and **No Parking** is permitted on any City street to allow snow plows to pass.
- * City Ordinances 660.04 and 660.05 require sidewalks, curbs or gutters to be cleared of snow and ice within a reasonable time, which will ordinarily not exceed 12 hours after any storm during which the snow and ice has accumulated.
- * The removal and disposal of ice and snow from private drives or parking lots into the City streets or across the street onto a tree lawn is prohibited per City Ordinance 600.04.
- * Stay back at least 100 feet when following a snow plow or salt truck.
- * If your mailbox is damaged by a snow plow, please contact the Service Department at (440) 353-0814 or you can report it online at nridgeville.org by clicking on Departments, then Service.
- * When your wipers are on, so should your headlights regardless of the time of day/night.
- * Do not allow children to play in or on snow drifts near streets or roadways. Safety first!
- * Please make sure fire hydrants are clear of snow and ice.
- * Live Christmas trees should be watered frequently to prevent fire hazards. Turn the lights off on your Christmas tree when you are not at home or at night when you are sleeping.
- * When using indoor electric and propane/kerosene heaters, be sure to keep them a safe distance away from combustible materials such as curtains, furniture and flammable items. Propane/kerosene heaters should be utilized in only well-ventilated areas.
- * When traffic lights are out, exercise safety by treating all intersections as four-way stops.
- * If you observe a street light out, contact Ohio Edison at 1-800-633-4766 to report the outage or you can call City Hall and we'll place the call on your behalf.
