- \$ Initially invested \$7.5 million through Meeder which is anticipated to generate an additional \$30K per year
- \$ CHIP Grants \$175K Received for 2015 to be completed by 12/31/16
 - 9 applications received for home rehab projects
 - 14 homeowners applied for Home Repair Projects
 - Estimated 4 home rehab projects (\$145,015) and
 6 home repair projects (\$46,200) will be awarded








Service Department

 Street Paving: Increased budget to \$745K, nearly 3x the amount from previous year

The following streets were paved in 2015:

- N. Lear Nagle from Adele to Center Ridge
- Bagley Road
- Chestnut Ridge from Turnpike bridge to Root Road
- Turn lane installed at Chestnut Ridge/Root Road
- Lexington Way
- South Central Park parking lot
- Added parking lot behind City Hall
- Relocated Handyside Road

Service Department (cont'd)

- Anticipate in 2016 increasing budget to pave secondary or residential streets
- Dura Patcher/Hot Box for winter repairs
- Seven salt trucks equipped with salt deicer
- Cargill Salt Pricing Fixing Settlement = \$16K
- 32 water main breaks repaired
- 9 fire hydrants replaced
- Over 5.5 miles of ditches cleaned

Utilities Department

- Nearly 13,000 water, sewer and sanitation accounts
- More than 4,500 new customers in last 15 years
- \$50K Recycling Grant from Lorain County Solid Waste Management District
 - Over \$1.8 million has been awarded over the last 23 years
 - Items purchased include traffic cones, construction barrels, road barricades, rubber playground mulch, Meals-on-Wheels food service containers, etc.









Local Government Revenue




CAT (Commercial Activity Tax)



Direct Local Government Revenue








