Mayor's Message...

This is an exciting time for North Ridgeville City Schools with the opening of the new North Ridgeville Academic Center. The new center houses grades 3 through 8 and is adjacent to the High School and Ranger Stadium. It is a state-of-the-art facility and progressive in the teaching and learning techniques that are being used in today's education. Also, with the kids back to school, please remember to drive safely and be aware of the children walking and biking to/from school and follow the laws regarding bus traffic and safety. We have so much to be proud of in our City and this is just one example as to why.



More good news! The City received our 25th grant approval from the Lorain County Solid Waste Management District in the amount of \$38,548.57 and nearly \$2 million in total. Funding is based on the total tonnage of recycling collected in each community in which North Ridgeville continues to be one of the community leaders in Lorain County when it comes to their residents recycling. These grant dollars received are earmarked for purchases of items that are made from recycled materials. Through the years, we have purchased items to benefit our

community such as trash receptacles, picnic tables and benches, traffic cones, barrels and barricades, playground equipment and rubber mulch for playground areas, community message boards, food service containers for Meals on Wheels, recycling brochures, and so much more. The grant also provides us with the funds to purchase "Watch Your Speed" signs that we make available at no cost to our residents. If you would like a sign for your yard or development, please stop by the Mayor's Office to pick one up. Thank you for participating in our community's recycling program!



While we are on the subject of recycling, out-of-date Yellowbooks are recyclable. Special Leaf Collection, October 31-November 28

Leaves may be placed at the curb in plastic bags beginning October 31 through November 28 on regular trash pick-up day. After November 28, leaves in plastic bags can only be left out as extra trash the first full week of each month during bulk pick-up. Simple Recycling – Free Curbside Recycling Program



North Ridgeville has a long history of recycling. The City started in 1992 by placing recyclable items in blue bags to be placed at curbside each week on trash day. Then, after piloting a two-cart system in several areas of the City the program was rolled out citywide in March 2011. Placing a mix of items from glass, plastic to paper in the green recycling containers has made it easier and more efficient for homeowners to take part in the community recycling program.

The City has signed an agreement, at **no cost** to the City or residents, with Simple Recycling to offer curbside collection of clothing, shoes, accessories, home goods such as kitchenware, books, toys, etc. Residents are provided

orange Simple Recycling bags to place their items in and leave at curbside every Tuesday on collection day. Simple Recycling has trucks in the City every Tuesday to pick up the items left out in the orange bags. Many residents already donate these items to North Ridgeville Community Care, Goodwill, Salvation Army, AMVETS, Planet Aid or other worthy organizations. You are encouraged to continue to donate your items to your charity of choice. This new program merely provides you with another option. The choice is yours.

Door-to-Door Solicitors

Chapter 854 of the North Ridgeville Codified Ordinance "Peddlers, Canvassers and Solicitors" defines this as any person who sells or offers for sale within the City any goods or chattels of any kind or description by going from house to house or from place to place through the streets of the City, taking such goods or chattels with him or her, or any person who sells such goods or chattels by subscription or by taking orders for future delivery of the same. This definition shall not apply to any minor under the age of eighteen years.

No solicitor who intends to go in or upon private property or a private residence for any commercial purpose shall do so without first registering in the Office of the Mayor and obtaining a solicitation permit. This permit is valid for one year from the date issued. Each solicitor at all times shall carry with him/her the permit to be shown when requested by the resident. If a solicitor is unable to produce a solicitation permit issued by the Mayor's Office, please contact the North Ridgeville Police Department immediately at (440) 327-2191 to report the incident. All door-to-door activity, of any nature, shall be restricted to the hours of 10 AM to 8 PM on Monday through Saturday and Noon to 5 PM on Sunday.

A "no solicitation or canvassing" sign posted in a visible and prominent location at a residence shall be sufficient to notify any unwanted peddlers, canvassers or solicitors that the permittee may not come upon the premises or if upon the premises the solicitor or canvasser shall leave immediately upon becoming aware of the sign or being made aware of the sign. If a solicitor ignores the sign and proceeds to conduct business in such a manner as to constitute a trespass upon private property or fraud, misrepresentation or false statements made in the course of conducting the activity, please report this to the Administrative Offices at (440) 353-0819. Permits may be revoked for any violation of the ordinance.

There are free "No Soliciting" window decals available at City Hall for residents that would like to prevent unwanted solicitors. You can find the ordinance in its entirety and an upto-date list of registered solicitors on the City's website at nridgeville.org.
