
The Fourth Annual TeamNEO Development Plus Awards were announced at a dinner on July 23, 2010 at Akron's John S. Knight Center. This event celebrates the "wins" in Northeast Ohio with projects that are helping to diversify and advance our economy. Over 650 people with diverse interests in Economic Development attended this stellar event.

Team Lorain County, the City of North Ridgeville, the City of Oberlin and the Lorain County Growth Partnership collaborated to win the award in the important category **Business Attraction** for our collaboration in attracting Greenfield Solar Corp. to Lorain County. Northeast Ohio provides a warm environment for this startup firm that makes cost efficient solar panels.

Greenfield Solar Corp. makes solar panels using a patented technology called PhotoVolt Mayor for which tiny cells collect sunlight to generate power at a lower cost to consumers. After considering Arizona, New Mexico, Oregon and Texas (all places with large semi-conductor markets vital to the solar energy industry) Greenfield selected Oberlin for its laboratory and headquarters and North Ridgeville for its manufacturing facility.

Steve Morey, President and CEO of Team Lorain County, recognized the value of attracting a growing advanced energy company like Greenfield which builds on the base of manufacturing that we're already known for and place it squarely into the new century. Greenfield Solar initially employed a team of 10, which has now increased to 25 and is projected to be a 200 employee company by 2012. Of the new jobs, 120 will be located in North Ridgeville.

On July 7th I received a Certificate of Special Congressional Recognition for receiving the 2010 Team NEO Business Attraction Award through the office of Congresswoman Betty Sutton of the 13th Congressional District. She added her congratulations and stated that, "You have made a tremendous impact on Northeast Ohio. On June 21st, members of the North Ridgeville Police Department participated in the Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics for the fourth consecutive year. The route began in Avon, traveled through North Ridgeville and ended at the Ohio State Highway Patrol Post in Elyria.

The Torch Run is popular with the officers that participate in it and has grown each year in Lorain County. This year the Torch Run included officers from Avon, Avon Lake, North Olmsted, North Ridgeville, Case Western Reserve University Police Departments, the Lorain County Sheriff's Department, Ohio State Highway Patrol, the Lorain County Community College Police Academy and the U.S. Marshall's Service. In all, over fifty-five law enforcement officers and police academy students participated in this year's Torch Run. To date, this event has raised over \$10,000.00 in donations for Ohio Special Olympics.

Current and Up-Coming City Projects

Boulder Drive Culvert Replacement

Work is progressing nicely with the north side almost completed. Installation is expected to be completed by the end of July.

Lorain Road Re-Construction Phase 3A

Work has slowed on this project because the high water table resulted in more extensive problems than originally expected with the installation of the sanitary sewer. To date, only the east portion has been completed with the west portion to be started after dewatering operations are completed. Construction of the temporary pavement on the south side of Lorain Road has been completed as well as the work required by the gas company. As soon as the sanitary installation is completed, work will begin on the new permanent concrete pavement on the north side of Lorain Road followed by construction of the permanent concrete pavement on the south side. Traffic will be maintained in both directions during this time, but there may still be delays encountered. Work is scheduled to be completed by September 15, 2010.

Repair of Deteriorated Concrete Pavement

Construction will begin on July 12 to repair deteriorated concrete pavement, catch basins and add curb ramps on a number of streets in the city. Work will be completed on streets in the following order; at 7299 Wil-Lou Lane, Debbie Drive from 6575 to 6617; Browning Drive at Miller Drive Intersection; Browning Drive at Nicoll Drive intersection; 6700 to 6720 Nicoll Drive; Nicoll Drive and Mitchell Drive intersection; Fox Hollow at Hickory Trail intersection; Hawthorne Hollow at Hickory Trail intersection; Gem Circle and Jewel Circle cul-de-sacs. Only \$200,000.00 is available for these projects, thus, work will be stopped as soon as that figure is reached.

Lorain Road Re-Construction Phase 3B

Bids will be opened for the re-constuction of Lorain Road from Honeycut to Island Road on July 12, 2010. If all goes well with this Ohio Public Works Commission project, work could begin about the middle of August. Hopefully, most of the paving work will be completed this construction year with landscape work being completed in early 2011.

Shady Drive Complex Improvements

Last year new bathrooms were installed at the Shady Drive Complex through CDBG Grant money obtained. This year a new concession stand has been added to the recently built building. This was funded by the Baseball Boosters and a \$5,000 grant from the Cleveland Indians (see picture at right).



In addition, batting cages (as shown to the left) have been installed for use by the youth of North Ridgeville. Tracy Arendt, who is in charge of the baseball program, is also overseeing these cages. This facility was built with funding from the Park & Rec Improvement Fund and the Baseball Boosters.
