- 1. We will not be able to have as many people in the building and there will be social distancing. Please call to reserve a spot.

It is hard to believe we are moving into the holiday season and will soon be putting the year 2020 behind us. This has been an unusual year to say the least with COVID-19 and the challenges we continue to face as a result of the pandemic. If we all continue to do our part by social distancing, wearing face coverings and frequent hand washings, we can help slow this virus down.

As the Senior Center reopens, it will certainly look very different. Meredith Bement who served as the Center's director has resigned her position to enjoy more time with her family. By the time this newsletter reaches you, we will have named a new Director. With new leadership, come new ideas. And, as we continue to deal with COVID-19, our staff will continue to work diligently to provide services and social events with your health and safety in mind and meet the guidelines set forth by Governor DeWine and Lorain County Public Health.

Lorain County Public Health (LCPH) will be offering no-cost flu shots at community clinics and at their office. To schedule an in-office appointment, call LCPH at 440-284-3206. Drive-thru flu shot clinics for adults ages 16 years and older will be held Monday, November 2 from 3-7 PM at Oberlin Fire Department, 430 S. Main Street in Oberlin and Saturday, November 7 from 9 AM-1 PM at Elyria Fire Department Station 2, 330 E. Broad Street in Elyria.

As a reminder, special leaf collection is October 27 thru November 24. Leaves can be placed at the curb in plastic bags during this time on regular trash collection day. After November 24 and through March, leaves and any other yard waste must be placed in the blue trash cart each week as space allows. The Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) rules states that no "source separated" yard waste can be disposed of in any solid waste landfill in the state from December through March. When placing yard waste in the blue cart, it simply becomes trash and no longer considered "source separated" allowing Republic Services to pick up yard waste while abiding by the OEPA rules.

Let's not forget the less fortunate during the holiday season. Our Parks & Recreation Department will be collecting non-perishable food items and new toys to benefit North Ridgeville Community Care. Drop off boxes are located at City Hall, Parks & Recreation and Senior Center starting November 2 through December 4. Please consider making a donation if you are able. Community Care also accepts monetary donations at their Center – located at 34015 Center Ridge Road (behind Arby's).

While we are on the subject of holidays, North Ridgeville Visitors Bureau will be sponsoring the annual Holiday on the Ridge on Saturday, December 5. The self-guided tour takes you to craft shows, business open houses and more. The annual tree lighting ceremony will take place at 5 PM at South Central Park Gazebo – join the High School Choir in festive songs while the scouts decorate the tree. I'll be on hand to flip the light switch. 

The Lock Box saves damage to your property and saves time for our paramedics when trying to gain access into your home. North Ridgeville Seniors, Inc., and the North Ridgeville Fire Department are proud to provide Lock Boxes to our North Ridgeville seniors. SENIOR SUPPER CLUB

Seniors can eat at St. John Medical Center's Terrace View Café (cafeteria) for a discount. Anyone over the age of 60 can simply pick up a card from our receptionist for a 40% discount on all food (except bottled beverages and "Simply to Go" items). There is a \$10 limit per customer for discount, after that the items are full price.

MEALS-ON-WHEELS

CAN WE HELP?

The North Ridgeville Office for Older Adults (Senior Center) offers a Meals on Wheels program to seniors 60 years and older. A nutritious meal is delivered right to their door on Mondays and Wednesdays for a total of up to 5 meals per week. Each meal is delivered before noon and contains an entrée and fruit or 100% juice. Meals are delivered in microwaveable containers and will need to be heated before consumption.

It is our goal to provide a nutritious noon meal to all of our clients; however, we cannot do special diets (e.g. diabetic). The price for a meal is \$3.75. Our friendly, courteous volunteer drivers pick up the meals from the Senior Center and deliver them to our clients. For additional information, please give us a call at (440) 353-0857.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR MEALS-ON-WHEELS?

Anyone 60 or older who lives in North Ridgeville. We do not adhere to any special diets so we do <u>require</u> a doctor's authorization prior to anyone being added to the program. Our case manager will do a home visit prior to signing up the client on Meals-On-Wheels.



Winter bill assistance available

Many Ohio families are struggling to pay their bills because of COVID-19's impact on the economy. There are several resources available to help customers maintain or reconnect gas service.

- The <u>Winter Reconnect Order</u> went into effect October 5. Customers whose service has been shut off because of non-payment, or who have received a shutoff notice, can reconnect for \$175 plus a

 The Winter Craise Program begins November 1. This program provides grants to income-eligible customers who have either been shut off or accurrently facing shut off. The most reliable way to know whether you have a leak is to have fully functioning carbon monoxide detectors at home, especially in areas where someone sleeps. 
