A MESSAGE FROM MAYOR CORCORAN

We are gearing up for a busy summer!

Our master plan process, *Ridgeville Ready*, continues to move forward and our steering committee is now exploring the potential of a future town center. We believe a strong town center could create a destination within the city, with a mix of uses and a vibrant public realm. To that end, the committee will be hosting a community event in July to gather your input. The Ready to Imagine! Town Center Pop Up Party will take place on the city hall campus at the corner of Avon Belden and Bainbridge Roads on Thursday, July 20 from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. In addition to sharing your feedback on our future town center, we have a DJ, sweet treats, raffles and family fun activities in store. The City and our partner agencies are working on numerous capital projects, ensuring our roadway network is meeting the needs of our community. Several projects have been completed, such as the Barres Road realignment and the Center Ridge Road urban paving project. Other projects continue to progress towards construction, including utility work at the future Stoney Ridge Road-Avalon Drive-Mills Road "peanut" roundabout and finalizing bid documents for the Cypress Avenue extension. On the subject of paving, our Service Department has 12 streets on their list to pave this year with an additional six concrete streets that will be repaired or replaced by an outside contractor. You can find the complete list of streets on our city's website at nridgeville.org, as well as the latest updates and repair schedule.

Our Parks & Recreation Department is once again offering free concerts at South Central Park Gazebo this summer. These performances are a great way to enjoy the outdoors and spend time with family and friends listening to live music. There are two remaining concerts in the series. Enjoy Disco Inferno on Sunday, July 2 starting at 5:00 p.m. and Funkology on Sunday, August 6 starting at 6:00 p.m. Don't forget your blanket or lawn chair!

More summer fun awaits us! The Corn Festival Committee is busy working on finalizing this year's activities. The event will be held August 11-13 on Bainbridge Road between Route 83 and Root Road. Lockboxes

A Lockbox prevents damage to your property and saves time for paramedics when needing to access your home in an emergency. The Senior Center and Fire Department are proud to provide this program to North Ridgeville residents. Lockboxes are available for seniors 60 and over for a \$35 fee. Those under 60 can obtain a Lockbox for a \$45 fee. Checks should be made payable to the North Ridgeville Senior Center. Applications can be found at the Senior Center or at

Supportive Services

Supportive services are provided for seniors 60 and older. These services provide linkage to social service agencies, home healthcare, supportive groups, and much more. The purpose of these services is to be a source of information for seniors and their families, and to assist older adults with maintaining independence.

Transportation

Limited transportation services are available for individuals 60 and older, who are medically unable to drive. Transportation is provided for routine medical appointments, grocery shopping, banking, human service appointments, pharmacy pick-ups and socialization at the Senior Center.

Blood Pressure Checks

Our friendly volunteer nurses are here the first Wednesday of every month from 10:30-11:45 a.m. This is a walk-in service, first come first served. **Upcoming dates July 5 and August 2.**

Senior Supper Club

Seniors can eat at St. John Medical Center's Terrace View Café for a discounted price. Anyone over the age of 60 can simply pick up a card from our front desk for a 40% discount on all food (except bottled beverages and "Simply To Go" items). There is a \$10 limit per customer for the discount, any purchases after that are full price.

North Ridgeville Community Care

Community Care is a human services agency for residents in need of food distribution or other basic needs. To inquire about assistance, call (440) 353-9716. Donations of goods and non-perishable food items can be arranged by calling Community Care during business hours, Mondays and Tuesdays 9:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m. and Thursdays 3:00-6:00 p.m.

Foot Care

Dr. Thomas Emmert, a Podiatrist with Total Care will return to the Senior Center on July 5th at 8:00 a.m. As always, appointments are first come first served by the sign-in sheet at the front desk. If it is your first visit with the doctor, it is recommended that you contact Dr. Emmert's office at (216) 529-1800 before your appointment to verify they have the necessary information. The cost of the clinic is usually covered by Medicare and supplemental insurance.

Meals-on-Wheels - Can We Help?

The North Ridgeville Office for Older Adults offers Meals-on-Wheels to seniors 60 and older. A nutritious meal is delivered on Mondays and Wednesdays for a total of up to 5 meals per week. Each meal is delivered before 12:00 p.m. and contains an entrée and fruit or 100% juice. Meals are delivered in microwaveable containers and need to be heated before consumption.

It is our goal to provide a nutritious 12:00 p.m. meal to all of our clients, however, we are unable to accommodate special diets (e.g. diabetic). Our friendly, courteous volunteer drivers pick up the meals from the Senior Center and deliver them to your door. The price for each meal is \$3.75.

Individuals 60 and older who live in North Ridgeville are eligible. As we are unable to adhere to special diets, a doctor's authorization <u>is required</u> before being added to the program. Our case manager will conduct a home visit prior to signing a client up to receive Meals-on-Wheels.

Stacey's Small Talk

Do you call them Lightning Bugs or Fireflies? Either way, one of my favorite summertime moments is sitting in my backyard and watching the lightning bugs (yes, that's what I call them). I



remember chasing them as a kid and not giving much thought to what was actually happening. But as an adult, I learned there's a lot more to them. The larva stage (similar to a caterpillar) lives for Fall, Winter & Spring feeding on slugs, snails, earthworms, and each other. If you get rid of the slugs, you are also getting rid of the Lightning Bugs. The adults usually emerge in the last half of June to early July. They only live 2-4 weeks as an adult, in which time they need to find a mate and lay eggs, to start the cycle over again.

These 2-4 weeks are jam-packed with lots of activity. Some feed on nectar or pollen, other insects, others feed only on other lightning bugs, and some don't eat at all during this stage. There are more than 24 species of lightning bugs found in Ohio. Each species has its own specific pattern of flashes, the height where they sit or fly, and the time of night they flash. Most of the time the females sit and flash their specific pattern and the males fly around flashing the correct response pattern. Once they locate another member of the matching species, they lay eggs and the cycle starts over. Some females will flash the pattern of a different species, when the bamboozled males approach them, they are devoured. The ability for a living thing to make light, without generating heat is called bioluminescence. There are chemicals inside their bodies that when combined with oxygen, glow. By flexing small muscles the insect controls the flow of oxygen into the abdomen portion of their body.
