A special thanks to the Rotary Club of North Ridgeville for sponsoring the event. Mark your calendar for Friday, September 24 and Friday, October 29 for the two remaining spaghetti dinners scheduled this year. My hope is the pandemic health orders will be lifted by then and that these two dinners will be held indoors at the Senior Center and not as a drive-thru. Watch for more details in a future newsletter.

With summer just around the corner, please consider taking advantage of our Parks & Recreation Department programming. Beginning Friday, June 4 at South Central Park Gazebo the Movies in the Park Series kicks off at dusk with *The Goonies* followed by June 18 *Jumanji: Next Level*, July 16 *Onward* and July 30 *Wonder Woman 1984*. Then, beginning Sunday, June 13 the Summer Concert Series kicks off at South Central Park Gazebo from 6-8 PM with the WIXY 1260 Ft. Cleveland Clearwater Revival followed by June 27 Just Jazz Live, July 11 Southern Cross Band and July 25 Bridgetown Junction. The movies and concerts are FREE! What better way to spend time with the family. Come early and enjoy a picnic in the park, spend time at the Splash Pad, enjoy the playground, walk the trail and try out the fitness equipment. And, don't forget to bring your fishing rod to catch a fish or two – no fishing license is required.

Below are several construction projects currently underway or will be commencing soon:

A roundabout will be constructed at Chestnut Ridge Road and Alternate SR 83. This intersection will close for up to 90 days beginning April 26, 2021. Closure and detour details are posted on the city's website.

The bridge over French Creek on Mills Road midway between Westminister Avenue and Greenwich Avenue will be replaced starting in May. One lane of traffic will be maintained during construction with the use of portable temporary signals.

Center Ridge Road sanitary sewer extension project is currently in the design phase with construction to follow to extend sewers from Barton Road east to the city limits for approximately 3,200 feet.

After careful review of the master plan report for Pavement Condition Rating (PCR), we identified the streets that will be paved/repaired this year within the city's allocated budget. Currently there are ten streets on the paving list that our Service Department will begin as early as the end of April or early May: Broad Boulevard, Charles Road, Emerald Street, Greenwich Avenue, Hedgerow Park Drive, Lorain Road (west of Island to SR 83), McKinley Avenue, Rose Street, Shady Moss Lane and Sycamore Street. The full-depth concrete repair list is comprised of six streets to begin in August: Greenlawn Drive from Center Ridge Road to 460 feet south, Harris Court, Nicoll Drive from Gail Drive to Browning Drive, Sourbrook Lane, Sweetbriar Court and Topaz Court.

American Heart Association CPR/Basic Life Support (BLS) Certification

This class is designed for healthcare professionals and other personnel who need to know how to perform CPR and other basic cardiovascular life support skills in a wide variety of in-facility and prehospital settings. Participants will learn high-quality CPR for adults, children, and infants, AHA Chain of Survival (BLS components), important early use of an AED Effective ventilations using a barrier device, importance of teams in multirescuer resuscitation and performance as an effective, team member during multirescuer CPR, and relief of foreign-body airway obstruction (choking) for adults and infants. 



The hiking stick program started in 1986 with 7 parks and 4,200 acres. This program was adapted to get people into the parks and enjoying nature. As an incentive, hiking sticks were given out after completing 10 hikes in 6 different parks (a list of hikes can be found in the Arrowhead newsletter). Please note that a park naturalist has to sign off on the hiking stick form. For returning participants, a metal tag is given to attach to your hiking stick.

Now with 28 parks and over 10,000 acres, the program continues today. It has become a great outing for the scout troops, senior citizens and families. What a fantastic way to visit your parks, learn about nature firsthand and engage in a healthy lifestyle. LOCK BOXES

The Lock Box saves damage to your property and saves time for our paramedics when trying to gain access into your home. North Ridgeville Seniors, Inc., and the North Ridgeville Fire Department are proud to provide Lock Boxes to our North Ridgeville seniors. A donation of \$30 is required for a Lock Box for seniors 60+. Lock Boxes are available to anyone else for \$40. Applications can be found at the Senior Center or at www.nridgeville.org. SENIOR SUPPER CLUB

Seniors can eat at St. John Medical Center's Terrace View Café (cafeteria) for a discount. Anyone over the age of 60 can simply pick up a card from our receptionist for a 40% discount on all food (except bottled beverages and "Simply to Go" items). There is a \$10 limit per customer for discount, after that the items are full price.

MEALS - ON - WHEELS

CAN WE HELP?

The North Ridgeville Office for Older Adults (Senior Center) offers a Meals-on-Wheels program to seniors 60 years and older. A nutritious meal is delivered right to their door on Mondays and Wednesdays for a total of up to 5 meals per week. Each meal is delivered before noon and contains an entrée and fruit or 100% juice. Meals are delivered in microwaveable containers and will need to be heated before consumption.

It is our goal to provide a nutritious noon meal to all of our clients; however, we cannot do special diets (e.g. diabetic). The price for a meal is \$3.75. Our friendly, courteous volunteer drivers pick up the meals from the Senior Center and deliver them to our clients. For additional information, please give us a call at (440) 353-0857.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR MEALS-ON-WHEELS?

Anyone 60 or older who lives in North Ridgeville. We do not adhere to any special diets so we do <u>require</u> a doctor's authorization prior to anyone being added to the program. Our case manager will do a home visit prior to signing up the client on Meals-on-Wheels.

OUTREACH PROGRAM

FOOT CARE

Dr. Thomas Emmert is the Podiatrist of Total Foot Care. At this time Dr. Emmert is taking appointments at his office in Lakewood. <u>He will not be visiting the Senior Center</u>. If it is your first visit with him, it is recommended that you contact Dr. Emmert's office before your appointment to insure they have the necessary information. They can be reached at (216) 529-1800. The cost of the clinic is usually covered by Medicare and supplemental insurance.

NORTH RIDGEVILLE COMMUNITY CARE

As the health and safety of their volunteers and clients is paramount Community Care has made the difficult decision to change the way they will be serving clients. They will be open, but will not have any volunteers at the center. North Ridgeville residents in need of food distribution will be assisted from a pass through at the side door. If you are a client and are homebound or feel it is unsafe to come out please call the center and they will make arrangements for you. Contact them at (440) 353-9716.

GOLDEN BUCKEYE CARD INFORMATION:

Participation in the Golden Buckeye program is free to all Ohio residents who are:

Age 60 or over (proof of age required).
Age 18-59 with a Social Security Administration defined disability.

If you are just turning 60 and have an Ohio driver's license, you will automatically be mailed your card just before your birthday. If you have not received the card four weeks after your birthday, or if your card was lost or stolen, call 1-866-301-6446 to get a new card.
