 - Eclipse Party Safety Kits: eclipse viewing glasses, safety information, and fun treats
 - Science backpacks for experiments to send eclipse data to NASA













Public Works - 2023 Highlights

Streets

- 13 streets paved and City Hall parking lot
- 30,000 lbs of crack seal
- 161 miles/111 hours street sweeping

Water

- 16 new water mains installed
- 27 curb box replacements
- 31 service line repairs/replacements
- 28 fire hydrants replaced

Sanitary & Storm

- 7.3 miles sanitary sewer maintenance
- 9.2 miles storm sewer maintenance
- 12+ miles of ditch cleaning
- 20+ miles of tree clearing/bank work

- Catch basin rehabilitation 35 locations












Ranger High-Tech Academy & North Ridgeville Academic Center

North Ridgeville High School

Honors, AP, and CCP Courses

- 14 Honors courses offered at NRHS
- 19 Advanced Placement courses offered at NRHS
 - 352 2023 high school graduates completed the AP exam with an average score of 3.03

- 18 College Credit Plus courses offered through partnership with Lorain County Community College
- 233 students received 1,998 hours of college credit in the 2022-2023 school year

Class of 2023

- 76% of students are currently attending a university
- 21% of students seeking employment and apprenticeship opportunities
- 3% of students enrolled in a military branch

- This is one way the district is *Empowering students* to design their preferred future













2024 Capital Improvement Projects

- SR 83 and Chestnut Ridge Road roundabout
 City share \$440,000; ODOT \$1.5 million
- Stoney Ridge Road, Mills Road and Avalon Drive roundabout
- Full depth concrete repairs (approx. \$900,000)
- Crack seal pavement (approx. 50 lane miles)
- Luanne, Monica & Carolyn road rehabilitation
 Lorain County CDBG award of \$150,000 to offset cost
- Mill Creek Conservation and Flood Control





Roundabout at SR 83 and Chestnut Ridge Road








2024 Capital Improvement Projects (cont'd)








Ridgeville Ready Master Plan

- Adopting resolution was introduced to City Council on March 18








Ridgeville Ready Master Plan Highlights
