NORTH RIDGEVILLE CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING MINUTES March 18, 2024

CALL TO ORDER:

President Jacobs called the Monday, March 18, 2024, Council meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

President Jacobs asked if there were any corrections to the City Council Meeting Minutes dated March 4, 2024. No discussion was offered. The meeting minutes stand approved as submitted.

LOBBY:

President Jacobs opened the lobby session. He reminded everyone that the lobby session was not meant to be an interactive question-and-answer session. However, it was an opportunity for the public to address the City Council and its administration. He asked anyone who would like to speak to come to the podium and state their name and address. He further added that each person is allowed three minutes to speak.

Roosters Complaint

Bill Eichler, residing at 36485 Schafer Dr, voiced his concerns regarding roosters in his neighborhood and the disturbing noise they produce. He expressed his belief that the presence of roosters is a nuisance and inquired about the possibility of implementing or revisiting a noise ordinance to address this issue.

ADMINISTRATORS REPORTS:

1. Mayor:

Mayor Corcoran remarked the following .:

- Opening of Police Station The North Ridgeville Police Department is now officially at their new station on Ranger Way. A ribbon cutting and open house are scheduled at their new facility on Saturday, April 27, 2024, from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.
- As of Monday, March 18, 2024, all City Hall, including Police, Fire, and Public Works phone numbers changed with the implementation of a new phone system. A postcard was mailed out last week to alert residents of this change. Please visit the city's website at nridgeville.org to obtain the list of all new departmental numbers. City Hall's main number is (440) 490-2042; Police Non-Emergency (440) 490-2001; Fire Non-Emergency (440) 490-2040 and Public Works (440) 490-2094.
- Primary Election March 19, 2024, is Election Day. Polls are open from 6:30 a.m. until 7:30 p.m. The City has two important issues on the ballot. Issue 7, a 2.25 mill levy renewal, that will provide funds to operate the city's paramedic service. Because this is a renewal of an existing levy, it will not result in any additional taxes to property owners.
 - In addition, the North Ridgeville Branch Library has a renewal on the ballot, Issue 8, a 1.91 mill renewal levy to provide operating revenues. This too, is a renewal and will not result in additional property taxes.
- State of North Ridgeville School Superintendent Roxann Caserio will be joining the Mayor as they deliver the State of North Ridgeville Address. This is a free event and open to the general public. The Address is on Thursday, March 21, 2024, at 6:00 p.m. at the North Ridgeville Academic Center. No RSVP is necessary.
- Easter Egg Hunt The Rotary Club of North Ridgeville will be hosting its annual Easter Egg Hunt, on Saturday, March 23, 2024, at the Ranger Stadium. Gates open at 12:30 p.m. and the egg hunt starts at 1:00 p.m. The Egg Hunt is for ages 1-9.
- Active Transportation Plan Meeting The Active Transportation Plan Connectivity Survey is still on the City's website. The City of North Ridgeville, in partnership with the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency (NOACA), is embarking on a public engagement process to gather community input for a citywide Active Transportation Plan. This plan builds upon recommendations from the recent Master Plan process in regard to connectivity and safety. The goal is to develop an interconnected trail and sidewalk network that links residents and workers to local and regional assets. The plan is to help prioritize future trail and sidewalk connections within the city by participating in the survey, available on the City's website, and by attending the various public meetings held throughout the planning process. The first meeting will be on Monday, March 25, 2024, at 6:30 p.m., at LCCC Ridge Campus.

- Cemetery Spring Clean Up In an attempt to beautify the city's cemeteries, the North Ridgeville Cemetery Department asked for help in clearing all plastic and artificial flowers and any other winter holiday-weathered decorations by Sunday, March 24, 2024. All items left will be disposed of beginning Monday, March 25, 2024, and will not be able to be retrieved.
- City Hall Offices Closed City Offices will be closed on Friday, March 29, 2024, in observance of Good Friday.

- The City received a NOACA grant of \$2 million for the Sugar Ridge Road rehabilitation project.
- On March 20, 2024, the outside eastbound lane on Center Ridge Road will be closed from 8:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Drivers will not be able to make a right-hand turn on State Route 83 during those times.
- The city's engineering contractor is addressing the contaminated soil issue on the city-owned property at the southwest corner by conducting borings in the pavement and on the property.
