

**NORTH RIDGEVILLE CITY COUNCIL
MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING MAY 18, 2015**

CALL TO ORDER: 7:30 P.M.

President Corcoran: Calling to order the Monday, May 18, 2015 regular Council meeting.

INVOCATION:

Led by President Corcoran.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Led by President Corcoran.

ROLL CALL:

Present were Council members Dennis Boose, Bernadine Butkowski, Robert Olesen, Roseanne Johnson, Dr. Ronald Arndt, Terrence Keenan and President Kevin Corcoran.

Also present was Mayor G. David Gillock, Safety-Service Director Jeffry Armbruster, City Engineer Scott Wangler, Auditor Chris Costin and Assistant Clerk of Council Tara L. Peet.

MINUTES - Corrections (if any) and approval:

President Corcoran: You have before you the Council meeting minutes of May 8, 2015. Are there any corrections or objections to approving those minutes? Seeing none, those minutes are approved.

President Corcoran: Please note the Planning Commission minutes of May 12, 2015 and the Workers Comp Safety Committee minutes of March 26, 2015.

Moved by President Corcoran and seconded by Arndt to bifurcate the lobby session to have two separate lobby sessions – the first designed to allow people to speak on items that are on the agenda this evening and a second lobby session before adjournment to allow for interaction between participants in the lobby session and the Council and Administration.

President Corcoran: Are there any comments or questions? All those in favor say yes. Those opposed say no.

LOBBY (REGARDING AGENDA ITEMS ONLY):

President Corcoran: We are at the first lobby session. If you wish to speak to one of the items on the agenda for this evening, now is your opportunity to do so. This lobby session will be used for the items that are on the agenda this evening. Please come to the podium; state your name and address for the record. You will be given three minutes to talk about the topic that is on the agenda. There won't be any interaction at this session, but if you want interaction there will be plenty of time at the other lobby session. Is there anybody that would like to address Council during this first lobby session?

President Corcoran: Seeing none, we will move on then to the Administrator's reports.

ADMINISTRATORS REPORTS:

A. Mayor: Thank you Mr. President. A few items this evening – first, T 92 is an ordinance to approve the driveway interceptor project at French Creek; the Abbey Road interceptor repair. This was appropriated. This is one that we have bid a number of times. We were never able to get it within the parameters of the engineering estimate. We now have so we would like to get this passed this evening to basically avoid the collapse of the degraded sewer. We would like to get started on this project as soon as we can. That is T 92.

We also have T 69 which is the French Creek UV disinfection system. This is working its way through. Presently, it would get its third reading around June 1 and if you add in a thirty day waiting period, it means we couldn't do a purchase order until July and the contractors are looking at a minimum time for installation of nine months. We have an EPA required disinfection start-up date of May 1 next year. This is putting us real close. We would like to get T 69 approved tonight.

Finally, on ordinance T 85 – this is our ordinance for purchasing a new salt truck. The contract with ODOT actually ran out at the beginning of May or the end of April. They are holding that contract over and open because there are a number of cities in the same position as we are. Again, this was appropriated so we would like to get it approved so we can get this truck ordered before they close that contract and we have to wait for a new contract to be awarded and I am sure the price will go up. So T 85 we would like to get passed this evening also.

Finally, I did receive a letter today. Today actually, from the Ohio Public Works confirming for our Jaycox Road project; we have received a grant in the amount of \$345,488.00. That is a good chunk of change for our residents to get that road fixed. It is sorely needed. Those monies will not be released until July 1. We can't award a construction contract until then so it will be later in the summer, but we did get the grant and we will be moving forward with the reconstruction of the first half of Jaycox this year. That concludes my report. Thank you.

President Corcoran: Thank you Mr. Mayor. Mr. Safety-Service Director.

B. Safety-Service Director: To add to the Mayor's comments – T 92 which is the interceptor repairs up front; certainly that is already budgeted as he suggested. I would like to have that passed. I wouldn't, but I would like to consider an emergency. T 69, that is part of the BAN's so if it is passed this evening it is okay to just let it go through to the thirty days because the BAN's will be up at that point. That concludes my report this evening.

Mayor Gillock: Mr. President, the Auditor just reminded me that T 69 cannot be passed tonight. That is the UV disinfection system because that is being funded through BAN's which will not be finished until around the first of June.

Safety-Service Director Armbruster: I just said that. Sorry about that.

Councilman Keenan: Mr. President, may I ask a question? Mr. Mayor, you talked about the Jaycox Road money coming in – congratulations. My question is – because you made the comment it would get done in the later summer, will we be able to advertise and be in a position to make an award as soon as we get the money or do we have to wait to get the money before we can even solicit the bids? I would hope we could get out in front.

Mayor Gillock: We can get out in front a little bit. We can go ahead and bid it. We just cannot sign the contract. We will do that.

Councilman Keenan: Okay. Excellent.

President Corcoran: Mr. Wangler.

C. Engineer: Thank you Mr. President. We got our bids in for full-depth concrete repair. We got four bids in which are decent for that project. The low bidder was Marrone Construction. We checked their references and stuff and it looks like they are going to be awarded that. It will start here soon to start the full-depth repair of concrete streets. That concludes my report.

President Corcoran: Thank you Mr. Wangler.

Councilman Arndt: Mr. President, if I may ask a question of our engineer? It almost seems like an oxymoron when we look at some of these ordinances for the lowest and best bidder. How is that? Is the way this process done for any of our projects – does it always go to the lowest bidder? I don't need a twenty minute dissertation.

Engineer Wangler: There are standards that we are held to. We don't always go to the lowest bidder. It is almost always the lowest bidder. There would have to be some exceptional mistake in their bid docs or a form that wasn't filled out. One time we had references that were just horrible. But barring something like that, it is going to go to the low bidder.

Mayor Gillock: Not to repeat what Scott was saying – as I was going to say, unless there is a disqualifier for some reason, it is going to go to the lowest bidder. We do check references and a lot of things and it is not always the lowest bidder.

President Corcoran: Mr. Auditor.

D. Auditor: Thank you Mr. President. Council should have received its latest April report and again, as a reminder to carry on with what we had talked about – you have heard twice now – T 69, I will remind you and 71 and 72 and 76 cannot be passed tonight because they will require a commitment on our issuance of BAN's and an appropriation ordinance, amended appropriations; both of which we should have in place by next meeting - the first meeting in June.

President Corcoran: So you included 71.

Auditor Costin: We are going to have to postpone that to the first meeting in July, if you would.

President Corcoran: Thank you very much.

Councilman Boose: Any why do we have to postpone T 71?

Auditor Costin: T 71 is reliant on the issuance of BAN's and when we have the commitment from BAN's we also have to do an amended appropriation ordinance because we have not appropriated any of these monies for which BAN's will be issued.

Councilman Boose: I thought we did the BAN's stuff at a meeting before.

Auditor Costin: That was to issue the BAN's. We have to get a commitment. Someone has to buy our BAN's now. They have to be sold. Once they are committed, we then have the right to appropriate the money.

Councilman Boose: You are confident that will happen between now and the next meeting?

Auditor Costin: Very much so because we have some BAN's that are due to be paid off in the first week of June and it would be a bit embarrassing if we didn't have the money to pay those off. I am very confident it is going to occur.

Councilman Boose: Thank you.

President Corcoran: Thank you Mr. Costin.

E. Other Reports:

President Corcoran: We have the March 2015 Building Department report, the April 2015 Fire Department report, the April 2015 Mayor's Court reports, the April 2015 Support Car report and the April 2015 Water Distribution reports.

When they send out a form, they love their forms; allow us to please and I know you didn't make that motion, you simply commented on it, but President Corcoran asked me if we could and I can understand why. For the purpose all understanding, the Mayor and I would agree to see if they would go along with it and let's maybe make that motion next time.
