

**NORTH RIDGEVILLE CITY COUNCIL  
MEETING MINUTES  
MARCH 2, 2020**

**CALL TO ORDER:** 7:30 p.m.

President DeVries called the Monday, March 2, 2020 Council meeting to order.

**INVOCATION:**

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:**

**ROLL CALL:**

Present were Council members Holly A. Swenk, Dennis Boose, President Pro-Tem Bruce Abens, Clifford Winkel, President Martin DeVries and James R. Maleski.

### **ADMINISTRATORS REPORTS:**

**A. Mayor:** Mayor Corcoran asked that City Council consider passing T 36 (amending appropriations), T 37 (Broad/Main/Pleasant sanitary sewer project- in order to get the project moving forward to utilize OPWC funding), T 40 (disk filter system at FCWWTP), T 42, T 43, T 44, T 45 (establishing funds for projects), T 46 (expend funds for Lear Nagle widening project), and T 47 (expending funds). He noted he would discuss each as they come forward.

Moved by Mayor Corcoran and seconded by Boose to suspend the By-laws to add T 47-2020 to the agenda under first readings.

**B. Safety-Service Director:** Safety-Service Director Armbruster stated he had a conversation with a gentleman who stated the last census in Lorain County was twenty percent under actual count. He encouraged people to complete the census and to be honest when answering the questions.

Safety-Service Director Armbruster stated the culvert is being prepared for the replacement at Chestnut and State Route 83. There will be detours in the future when drainage is completed.

**C. Engineer:** Engineer Rodriguez stated culverts are being replaced at State Route 83, just south of Chestnut. The pipes are being replaced before the road is resurfaced. They are looking to close the road and detour traffic for two days to try and complete the work quickly. He stated they are looking at the beginning of April and will notify the public when they have exact dates.

He noted that paving has begun on Center Ridge Road. They will get down to Jaycox by the end of this week and bricks will be removed by next week.

Engineer Rodriguez stated everyone will see legislation coming forward for projects that were approved during appropriations.

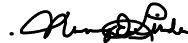
